Shared Operating Assumptions and Objective

Operating Assumptions for Oregon Post-Secondary Resumption:

- Student-centered: Universities and Colleges are committed to providing the greatest level of choice and flexibility to support student access, progression and success.
- Shared criteria, flexibility in approach Each University and College will have the flexibility to determine how and when students return, but will manage to shared criteria for maintaining public health agreed to by all Oregon higher education institutions and health authorities
- Local coordination and collaboration. University/college capacity to resume on-site operations will be based on local circumstances and regional readiness as determined by the respective county health authority and university/college leadership.

Shared Objective for Oregon Post-Secondary Resumption Planning:

- · Pending state authorization, deploy a university or college reopening plan to safely return students, faculty, staff, volunteers, and community to regular activity over a series of the phased lifting of restrictions.
- Apply Oregon's Gating Criteria and Preparedness Requirements consistently among Oregon's universities and colleges for resuming regular operations.
